May Willis and Mr. Stone - as you are aware from an earlier email from Leland Manager Mr. Hollis, the Town of Leland has declined to provide matching funds for Wave Transit Route 204 in FY 2021. While the decision is unfortunate, Wave Transit would like to offer the Town of Navassa and Brunswick County the opportunity to fund the local match required to continue the route through FY 2021. Leland's contribution to the route in FY 2021 was scheduled to be \$54,636, which is the same amount from FY 2020. Should the Town of Navassa and/or Brunswick County be willing to make up the lost revenue, please let me know by May 22, 2020. Should Leland's matching funds not be made up, the Authority will begin the public comment procedure to end service to Brunswick County on May 29, 2020. The final day of service would be August 28, 2020. Thank you for your consideration and support of transit in the region.
