I am pleased to inform you that based on and in reliance upon the information and materials provided by Brunswick County, the Center for Tech and Civic Life ("CTCL"), a nonprofit organization tax-exempt under Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") section 501(c)(3), has decided to award a grant to support the work of Brunswick County ("Grantee").

The following is a description of the grant:

AMOUNT OF GRANT: \$67,291.00 USD

PURPOSE: The grant funds must be used exclusively for the public purpose of planning and operationalizing safe and secure election administration in Brunswick County in 2020 ("Purpose").

Before CTCL transmits these funds to Grantee, CTCL requires that Grantee review and sign this agreement ("Grant Agreement") and agree to use the grant funds in compliance with the Grant Agreement and with United States tax laws and the laws and regulations of your state and jurisdiction ("Applicable Laws"). Specifically, by signing this letter Grantee certifies and agrees to the following:

- 1. Grantee is a local government unit or political subdivision within the meaning of IRC section 170(c)(1).
- 2. This grant shall be used only for the Purpose described above, and for no other purposes.

- 3. Grantee has indicated that the amount of the grant shall be expended on the following specific election administration needs: Temporary staffing. Grantee may allocate grant funds among those needs, or to other public purposes listed in the grant application, without further notice to or permission of CTCL.
- 4. Grantee shall not use any part of this grant to make a grant to another organization, except in the case where the organization is a local government unit or political subdivision within the meaning of IRC section 170(c)(1) or a nonprofit organization tax-exempt under IRC section 501(c)(3), and the subgrant is intended to accomplish the Purpose of this grant. Grantee shall take reasonable steps to ensure that any such subgrant is used in a manner consistent with the terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement, including requiring that subgrantee agrees in writing to comply with the terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement.
- 5. The grant project period of June 15, 2020 through December 31, 2020 represents the dates between which covered costs may be applied to the grant. The Grantee shall expend the amount of this grant for the Purpose by December 31, 2020.
- 6. Grantee is authorized to receive this grant from CTCL and certifies that (a) the receipt of these grant funds does not violate any Applicable Laws, and (b) Grantee has taken all required, reasonable and necessary steps to receive, accept and expend the grant in accordance with the Purpose and Applicable Law.
- 7. The Grantee shall produce a brief report explaining and documenting how grant funds have been expended in support of the activities described in paragraph 3. This report shall be sent to CTCL no later than January 31, 2021 in a format approved by CTCL and shall include with the report a signed certification by Grantee that it has complied with all terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement.
- 8. This grant may not supplant previously appropriated funds. The Grantee shall not reduce the budget of the County Board of Elections ("the Election Department") or fail to appropriate or provide previously budgeted funds to the Election Department for the term of this grant. Any amount supplanted, reduced or not provided in contravention of this paragraph shall be repaid to CTCL up to the total amount of this grant.
- 9. CTCL may discontinue, modify, withhold part of, or ask for the return all or part of the grant funds if it determines, in its sole judgment, that (a) any of the above terms and conditions of this grant have not been met, or (b) CTCL is required to do so to comply with applicable laws or regulations.
- 10. The grant project period of June 15, 2020 through December 31, 2020 represents the dates between which covered costs for the Purpose may be applied to the grant.

Approved the Division of Public Health Agreement Addendum and authorized the Health Director to sign the addendum form.

10. Health and Human Services - Social Services - Leland House NEMT Contract for FY 20-21

Approved the contract for Leland House Non-Emergency Medicaid Transportation Services.

11. Operation Services - Emergency Watershed Protection Program

Approved submittal of an updated application document for round 2 of Brunswick County's USDA-Emergency Watershed Protection Program to address watershed impairments due to Hurricane Florence and authorized the County Manager to sign the application, contract, and any further minor revisions.

12. Superior Court Judge - SAMHSA Court Expansion Grant

Accepted the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Expansion Grant in the amount of \$400,000 for year three (09/30/20-09/29/21) of the Brunswick County Adult Treatment Court Expansion Project and approved contract agreements for treatment, participant transportation, trial court coordinators and data evaluation. The grant has a five-year project period beginning 09/30/2018 through 09/29/2023 for a total award amount of \$2,000,000.

13. Tax Administration - September 2020 Releases

Approved the September 2020 tax releases.

VI. PRESENTATION

1. Sheriff's Office - Detention Center MOA with NCDPS (Sheriff John Ingram)

Request that the Board of Commissioners approve a Memorandum of Agreement with the North Carolina Department of Public Safety and the Brunswick County Sheriff's Office to provide juvenile detention services at the Brunswick County Detention Center. The MOA would require four additional Jailer I positions, one Detective position, one Administrative Assistant position, and a new revenue line in the Detention Center departmental budget.

Sheriff Ingram explained that the Memorandum of Agreement was an agreement between the Sheriff's Office and the Department of Public Safety (DPS) for the purpose of housing juveniles. A twelve-bed area within the Brunswick County facility has been identified to provide the space required by DPS for sight and sound separation. The two-year agreement guarantees ten beds at the rate of \$244 per day per bed and auto-renews every two years. Two beds were kept open to house juveniles from within Brunswick County. Four detention offices, one administrative assistant, and one drug officer was requested. The drug officer position was requested to close the gap from a previous request during the budget cycle and is not tied to the juvenile detention services. The Sheriff's Office would like to work with the County to set aside the funds generated, over \$500,000 in revenue, for planning for phase III as it relates to DPS's needs to potentially house several more juveniles moving forward.

Should the auto-renewal not happen, the Sheriff's Office would determine if staffing could be maintained based on the needs at the time, or look at utilizing those positions throughout the county. If it is determined the positions are no longer needed, the necessary cuts would be made. The contract, if approved, will be in place for 30 days or more without actually housing anyone to allow the Sheriff's Office to put the revenue stream in place to begin the process. The Sheriff noted that the program would not be feasible without the positions requested, with the exception of the drug officer, as there is a requirement for a certain number of detention officers per juvenile.

Following discussion Vice-Chairman Thompson moved to approve the Memorandum of Agreement as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cooke and passed unanimously.

VII. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

1. Utilities - Senior Construction Inspector Position (John Nichols, Public Utilities Director)

Request that the Board of Commissioners approve a full-time Senior Construction Inspector position.

Mr. Nichols explained that there are currently two Inspectors and a Construction Manager assigned to 44 utility projects, including capital projects and in-house projects. There are three major projects in the northeast, to include the Northwest Water Treatment Plant (\$130 million), the Northeast Regional Wastewater System Expansion (\$50 million) and the transmission system projects associated with those, and only one inspector assigned to those projects. Staff anticipated requesting another inspector prior to COVID-19.

Following a discussion on the need to be proactive to address the growth and demand on the system rather than reactive, Commissioner Forte moved to approve the full-time Senior Construction Inspector as requested. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cooke and passed unanimously.

VIII. OTHER BUSINESS/INFORMAL DISCUSSION

No other business/informal discussion items were brought forth.

IX. <u>CLOSED SESSION</u>

1. Closed Session

Request that the Board of Commissioners enter in Closed Session pursuant to N.C.G.S.143-318.11(a)(1) to approve closed session minutes, and 143-318.11(a)(3) to consult with its attorney to protect the attorney-client privilege.

Mr. Shaver noted that the statutory requirements were included in the agenda with the purpose to approve closed session minutes and consult with the attorney.

Commissioner Sykes moved to enter Closed Session as stated at 6:20 p.m. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cooke and passed unanimously.

Chairman Williams called the Regular Session to order at 7:33 p.m. and asked the County Attorney if there was anything to report from Closed Session.

Mr. Shaver stated there was no action to report from Closed Session.

Request that the Board of Commissioners approve the Agreement Addendum 115 COVID-19 Infection Prevention Support for FY 20-21.

Background/Purpose of Request:

The North Carolina General Assembly passed Session Law 2020-4 (H1043) to fulfill their constitutional duty to appropriate all funds, including federal CARES Act funds appropriated or otherwise made available under the COVID-19 Recovery Legislation, and to direct the use of those funds in a manner that is consistent with authorizing federal legislation and that responsibly provides for the public health and economic well-being of North Carolina. Through this legislation, the Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) was established.

The primary purpose of the CRF is to provide necessary and appropriate relief and assistance from the effects of COVID-19. These funds were provided to the Department of Health and Human Services to provide flexible funds for local health departments to support infection-prevention related activities.

This Agreement Addendum enhances the Local Health Department's ability to support infection prevention during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The total allocation for Brunswick County is \$169,625.00.

Staff recommends approval of the Agreement Addendum.

Performance will be monitored by the LTAT Branch Head by a review of the Activity 115 Infection Prevention Reports. If additional information is required, a phone conference will be conducted.

VI. Funding Guidelines or Restrictions:

- 1. Requirements for pass-through entities: In compliance with 2 CFR §200.331 Requirements for pass-through entities, the Division of Public Health provides Federal Award Reporting Supplements to the LHD receiving federally funded Agreement Addenda.
 - a. Definition: A Supplement discloses the required elements of a single federal award. Supplements address elements of federal funding sources only; state funding elements will not be included in the Supplement. Agreement Addenda funded by more than one federal award will receive a disclosure Supplement for each federal award.
 - b. Frequency: Supplements will be generated as the Division of Public Health receives information for federal grants. Supplements will be issued to the LHD throughout the state fiscal year. For federally funded AAs, Supplements will accompany the original AA. If AAs are revised and if the revision affects federal funds, the AA Revisions will include Supplements. Supplements can also be sent to the LHD even if no change is needed to the AA. In those instances, the Supplements will be sent to provide newly received federal grant information for funds already allocated in the existing AA.

- 2. Any infection prevention capital improvement directly related to the COVID-19 public health emergency **must receive preapproval** from DPH Program Contact, Susan Little, in writing prior to expending.
- 3. The following is a nonexclusive list of costs that would **not** be eligible expenditures:
 - a. Administrative costs. Neither indirect costs nor allocated overhead are allowable costs. All salary expenses for permanent employees must be direct expensed.
 - b. Lobbying. Federally funded lobbying, either directly or indirectly (i.e., "grassroots" lobbying), is prohibited by law.
 - c. Expenses for the State share of Medicaid.
 - d. Damages covered by insurance.
 - e. Payroll or benefits expenses for employees whose work duties are not substantially dedicated to mitigating or responding to the COVID-19 public health emergency.
 - f. Expenses that have been or will be reimbursed under any federal program.
 - g. Reimbursement to donors for donated items or services.
 - h. Workforce bonuses other than hazard pay or overtime.
 - i. Severance pay.
 - j. Legal settlements.
 - k. Elective abortion or on research in which a human embryo is destroyed, discarded, or knowingly subjected to risk of injury or death.
 - i. The prohibition on payment for abortions does not apply to an abortion if the pregnancy is the result of an act of rape or incest; or in the case where a woman suffers from a physical disorder, physical injury, or physical illness, including a life-endangering physical condition caused by or arising from the pregnancy itself, that would, as certified by a physician, place the woman in danger of death unless an abortion is performed.
 - ii. Furthermore, no government which receives payments from the Coronavirus Relief Fund may discriminate against a health care entity on the basis that the entity does not provide, pay for, provide coverage of, or refer for abortions.
- 4. The final drawdown of funds for services performed through December 30, 2020 request must be submitted in the Aid-to-Counties database no later than 01/15/2021.

Background/Purpose of Request:

As part of Local Health Department Accreditation requirements, certain Board of Health policies must be reviewed and approved by the Board of Health/Board of Commissioners annually. These policies are as follows:

 - b. The Health Director is responsible for reviewing and updating the Board of Health handbook. The material included should be regularly updated and information replaced as appropriate.
- 2. Board members will participate in ongoing continuing education.
 - a. Board members will receive ongoing training related to the responsibilities and authority of the local board of health. It could also cover any relevant or emerging public health topic (such as isolation or quarantine authorities as related to an emerging infectious disease or updates to state environmental health rules). The training must include/highlight the BOH rule-making or other authority as it relates to that topic. On-going training can be done in groups, one on one, or through self-guided training and must occur at least once every 4-year accreditation cycle.

Greetings Chief Deputy Miller:

I hope this letter finds you well. Wellpath is proud to partner with the Brunswick County and we are excited to move into another year of delivering quality healthcare to the inmates in your custody. We appreciate the opportunity to provide this revised proposal.

Contract Auto-Renewal

The current term of our Agreement will end on September 30, 2020. Per Section 9.0, the Agreement will automatically renew for an additional one-year period beginning on October 1, 2020.

Compensation Adjustment

As set forth in Section 9.0.1, we request an increase in the base compensation amount in accordance with the Consumer Price Index – All Urban Consumers, US City Average, Medical Care Services, not to exceed 4%. As previously presented in our letter dated January 10th, the most recently released CPI at that the time was 5.1% for the month of November 2019.

Therefore, application of the 4% increase revises the annual amount to be paid for professional health care services rendered at the Brunswick County Detention Center from \$1,175,685 to \$1,222,712.40 for October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021 paid in equal monthly installments of \$101,892.70.

Revised Staffing Enhancements

Per recent discussion with David Hackworth, we have revised our proposed staffing to the following positions:

- Increase of 0.35 FTEs of Certified Medical Technician Two additional hours each day
- Increase of 0.40 FTEs of Licensed Practical Nurse Two additional 8 hour shifts on the weekends

The total annual cost for the proposed enhancements is \$43,638, however, the positions can be added individually if the County so chooses. The following table details the cost breakdown per position. If the County confirms acceptance by checking below, the staffing change(s) will become effective October 1, 2020 and the cost(s) will be added to the revised base compensation amount noted above.

This Change order will consist of a time extension of 113 days and a contract deduction in the amount of \$4,999.51.

Background/Purpose of Request:

The 211 Water Treatment Plant (WTP) has been in continuous service supplying drinking water to Brunswick County since 1975. The existing steel Evoqua filters reached the end of their useful service life and were due for replacement.

On January 21, 2020, the Board approved a budget amendment in the amount of \$1.2 million for the construction of the filters. The project was then advertised and awarded to Carmichael Construction Company on March 16, 2020, in the amount of \$1,049,000.00. The Notice to Proceed was then issued on March 24, 2020, to allow construction to begin.

This change order reflects a time extension of 113 calendar days to reach final completion. The extension is necessary due to the COVID-19 Global Pandemic, Hurricane Isaias, and delays associated with the challenges faced with retrofitting a 40 plus year old water treatment plant.

This change order also reflects a deduction in the original contract price in the amount of \$4,999.51 setting the revised contract total to \$1,044,000.49.

We are writing to request a time extension for the Hwy 211 Water Treatment Plant Tank Demolition, and Construction of five new Sand Filter Tanks, and for the liquidated penalties to be waived due to the specifics of the project and the Coronavirus 2019 Pandemic (COVID-19).

We are all aware of the ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic, which was declared by the World Health Organization, the President of the United States, the Governor of NC, and Brunswick County, (see letters attached).

Here are some of the timelines of the Project, COVID-19 issues, and the construction process.

- 2. Original bid date, February 17th, 2020
- 3. Only two bidders are present.
- 4. A New Bid date set for March 4th, 2020.
- 5. Carmichael Construction Company Inc. (hereinafter as "CCC") is the apparent low bidder on March 4th.
- 6. CCC received an email from Brunswick County on March 5th, 2020, that a request for award will be presented at the next Board of Commissioners meeting on March 16th.
- 7. NC Governor Roy Cooper announces a State of Emergency due to COVID-19 on March 10th, 2020 Executive Order #116.
- 8. NC Governor Roy Cooper announces for all schools to close on March 14th, 2020, Executive Order #117.
- 9. The materials on this project were provided by Brunswick County, and a request for CCC to unload these materials was asked, and we agreed to help expedite the project per the March 5th email.
- 10. Notice of Award was given during the commissioners meeting on March 16th, 2020.
- 11. NC Governor Roy Cooper announces all Restaurants and Bars to close and approves unemployment benefits to be readily available on March 17th, 2020 Executive Order #118.
- 12. Purchase order number was emailed to CCC on March 20th, 2020 for the project.
- 13. CCC met Subcontractors on site Friday March 20th to discuss material delivery and construction process and equipment mobilization to unload county's materials.
- 14. CCC rented a crane and operator from Edwards to help with the unloading of the County's tank material, (Scheduled for Monday March 23rd, and possibly Tuesday 24th).
- 15. NC Governor Roy Cooper waives restrictions on childcare, and elder care. Executive Order #119.
- 16. Material deliveries started on Monday March 23rd, 2020.
- 17. NC Governor Roy Cooper extends school closings, on March 23rd, 2020, Executive Order #120.
- 18. Notice to Proceed was issued on March 24, 2020 and was received by email on March 26th, 2020.
- 19. Brunswick County Declares a State of Emergency on March 24th, 2020. (Letter attached).
- 20. During the material delivery it was noticed there were some questions about the valves, it seemed they needed reducers to install them. The County's inspector found the items needed in their stock and made a trip to Fastenal for hardware needed later. Carmichael's Crew went to the County's facility on Grey Water Road to get some of these items needed on March 26th. (No reducers were needed).
- 21. Pre-construction meeting was scheduled for Thursday March 26th at 11am on site. During this meeting the scope of work was discussed, and Walter Carmichael mentioned the deadline of May 18th had not been adjusted to the new bid date and there was no way of making the original date, but we would do the best we could to get the project done in a timely manner.

- 22. CCC received NCDPS credentials, a Certificate of post Disaster Re-entry in accordance with N.C.G.S. 166A-19.70 which granted us entry and was to be placed in our vehicles coming and going into the water treatment facility on March 26th, 2020.
- 23. NC Governor Roy Cooper announces, and issues a stay at home order, March 27th, 2020, Executive Order #121.
- 24. Materials were counted and separated into different piles per tank, and/or installation order from Monday 23rd through Friday 27th.
- 25. A few of the 90-degree bends had the wrong size connections so a change order was done to correct the issue.
- 26. We received an email on Essential businesses on March 30th, 2020 from the County. CCC sent an email to the County letting them know we would continue the work at the Hwy 211 water treatment facility, and notice was given of possible delays due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. (Email attached).
- 27. Demolition was started on tanks 3 and 4 Monday March 30th, and the sand was pumped out of the first tanks on March 31st. Sand was found in two of the tank compartments, and should only have been in one compartment we contacted the County and it was agreed we would pump out both compartments out without a change to the project. Later this was found in other tanks and a change order was given as needed to accommodate the extra work done.
- 28. As construction on the sand filter tanks moved forward, the NC Executive Orders were being placed on the public we at CCC became concerned for our employees and their safety. After one employee quit and knowing unemployment benefits were more readily available, we decided to pay our employees an additional \$40.00 per day. We called it hazard pay and hoped it would keep our employees at work and our projects moving forward. The additional pay started April 27th and it was done for an 8-week period, ending June 21st, 2020. This did keep our employees at work and boosted their morale.
- 29. The County held a progress meeting on April 30th, 2020 at 11am. During the progress meeting construction of the tanks were discussed and CCC informed the County we had moved some of the materials to the welding shop in Riegelwood, so some of the assembly and painting could still be done there while other items were being assembled here on site. This would also help productivity when we have inclement weather and help with the other tank assembling as we move forward. The County asked if it was possible to bring on more welders to help, and we agreed to try. Work time frames for crews were discussed and at this point of construction CCC crews and subcontractors had been working 5 days a week Monday through Friday from 7:30am to 6:00pm per the General Conditions Article 33 in the project specifications. It was asked if we could work Saturdays, and CCC agreed to work Saturdays to help expedite the construction process.
- 30. Due to COVID we tried to maintain the same crews on site, and tanks 3 and 4 were completed around Memorial Day weekend. As we approached the summer months and water demand became an issue. It was also necessary to increase crane rental to meet the demands of tank removal and placement that we had not planned on. (No extra cost was requested).
- 31. Paint drying times for submersion became an issue pushing the limits for the new tank startups.
- 32. Tanks 1 and 2 were completed by July 1st just in time for the 4th of July vacation period.

- 33. CCC and subcontractors were asked to hold on the last tank #5 due to the holiday and we agreed. (No work between July 1st to July 6th).
- 34. CCC and subcontractors returned to work on July 7th, and tank #5 was taken offline and we started the demolition and completed tank #5 on July 31st.
- 35. Paint was inspected by S&ME on Monday morning August 3rd, and sand was placed.
- 36. Hurricane Isaias made landfall that afternoon, and no work was done on August 4th, due to power outages and water demands because of a leak on Oak Island.
- 37. On Wednesday August 5th we proceeded with the change order for the Wye and header pipe repair. Crews finished the work on Thursday 6th, and then the painting was done on header, and wye.
- 38. CCC then started on the existing building Demolition change order. Equipment was moved on Monday August 10th, and crew started on Demolition Tuesday 11th and found the concrete footer was 24" thick, and slab 12" thick, so a rental excavator w/jack hammer was moved in to help with the extra concrete found. Our original plan was to cut the slab into sections for a cleaner removal process, the extra concrete thickness was not known. The demolition on the building was completed on Friday August 28. Dirt was hauled in on Monday 31st for the new building slab area. During the demolition of the existing building, we verified existing utilities, and their grades with the county for the proposed 12" storm drain and grade work around new tanks.
- 39. A walk through was done on the new sand filter tanks on August 17th, and a punch list was emailed to us from the Brunswick County inspector. The Paint crew tried to work on paint touch ups requested on punch list, but the condensation caused an issue, so tank shut downs are necessary, and water demands will dictate when. (Punch list attached).
- 40. Equipment was mobilized for the 12" CPP storm drain and grade work change order around the new tanks. The grade was needed to keep water from standing around the new tanks. Work started Tuesday September 1st and was complete Friday September 4th.
- 41. Paint touch ups on tanks 1 and 2 were done September 3rd and 4th, and tanks 3, 4, and 5 should be next, but water demands will dictate shut down. (It is a possibility they could be done next week).

The project has had its challenges due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the rain during the construction process including a hurricane. Despite the challenges, we endeavored to persevere on the job site including purchasing tarps to cover the tanks so work could continue. The County's representatives and CCC have done a great job in keeping a safe environment and working together for water shut down periods for the construction to continue during peak water demands this summer. Due to the usual work conditions, short contract time frame, COVID-19, and the weather we faced, we ask you to grant the extension of time for this project as well as the waiver of the liquidated damages/penalties.





Issue/Action Requested:

Request that the Board of Commissioners receive information for Fiscal Year End June 30, 2020 and consider an appropriation of fund balance to pay-go future projects planned in the 5 Year Capital Improvement Plan.

Background/Purpose of Request:

There are several projects identified in the 5 Year Capital Improvement Plan. As in past years the county strives to maximize the use of pay-as-you-go financing for capital projects to minimize debt levels and is contingent on the fiscal year end results. The unassigned fund balance as a percent of expenditures plus transfers as of June 30, 2020 is 35%.

To continue pay-go funding for the County Capital Improvement Plan Projects and to implement the recommendations identified in the space and facility needs study that is underway, an additional \$10 million transfer to the County Capital Reserves will reduce the unassigned fund balance to 31% which is within policy goal of maintaining 27% - 35%.











Water and Sewer <u>Average</u> Daily Treatment/Capacity Gallons








Enterprise Fund Pledged Revenue Debt Coverage Ratios






Governmental Funds: Total Revenues and Expenditures










January 2019 Revaluation became effective for 2020 Ad Valorem Collections



Real & Motor Vehicle Property Tax Collection Rates







General Fund Local Option Sales Tax & Intergovernmental Revenue






General Fund Permits & Fees/Sales & Services






Total General Fund Balance & Fund Balance Remaining for Appropriation
